Are future activities planned after the project?	IN:FaTE Dover is a new research network formed through the partnership of IRHiS Lille, Art History Dpt. UGent, and Art History Dpt. Kent University. The network focuses on fashion and textiles in Northern France, Flanders and South East England (regions bordering the Strait of Dover) from 1500 to 1950. The network aims to strengthen ties, foster collaborations, and share research between professors, postdocs, PhDs, and students at all three institutions who work on related research. In order to launch the network and share findings, IN:FaTE Dover will organize a 2-day colloquium in March 2022 on the theme of "Fashion and Textiles Exchanges around the Strait of Dover (northern France, Flanders, South East England), 1500-1950". The network will reach out to strategic partners at neighboring universities and museums to form a steering committee. A CFP will raise awareness and bring international participation. The colloquium will consist of 10 papers, a roundtable, and a steering group meeting. 50-60 participants are expected. The papers will be edited and published (English/French) by the University Press of Lille, within the new collection dedicated to fashion studies launched by Isabelle Paresys and Damien Delille. The network will meet yearly thereafter. Meiss and Bass-Krueger collaborated in the RIG ACORSO. This is their first collaboration with Thomas.
